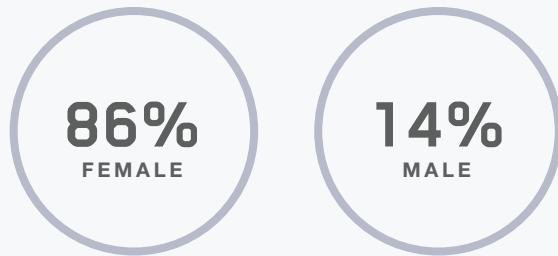

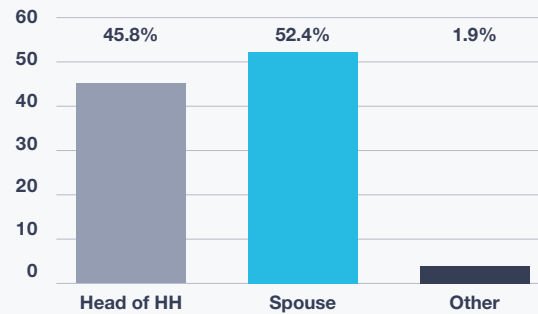

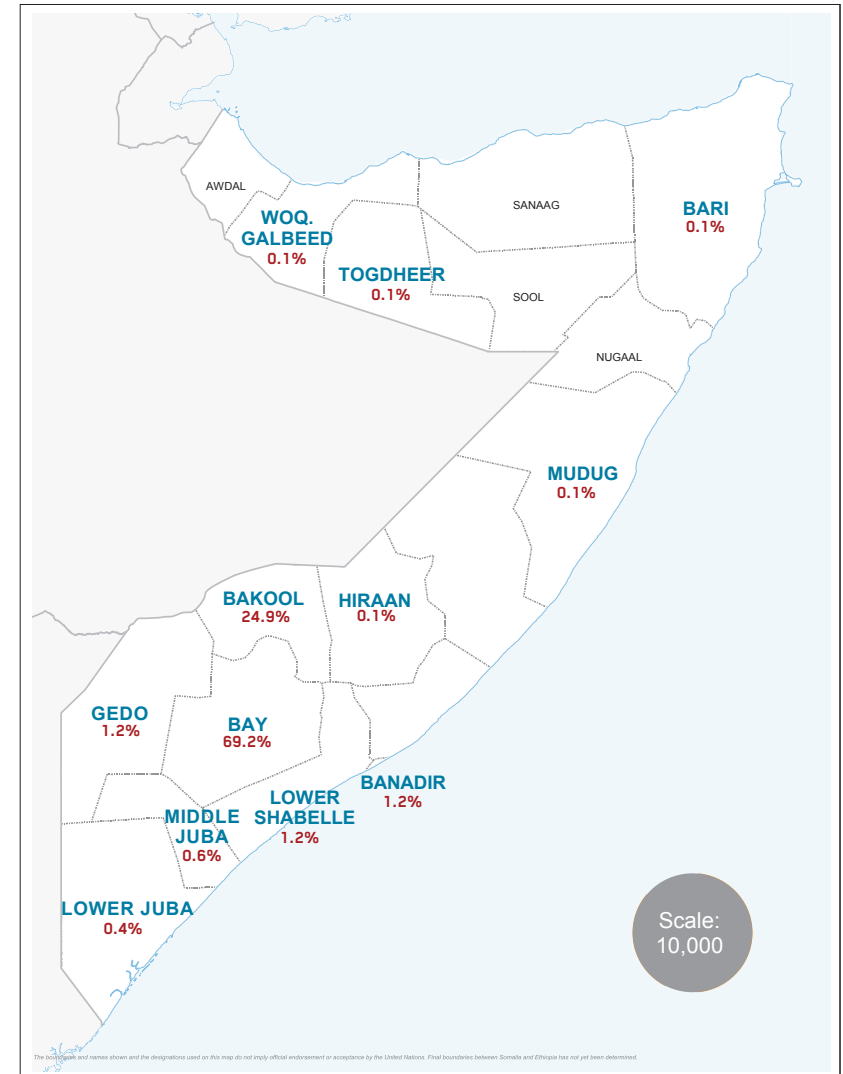
Gender of the Respondent



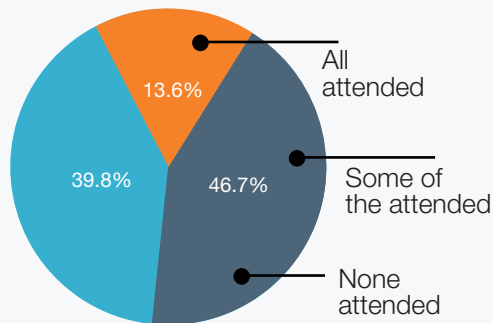
## Role of the respondent



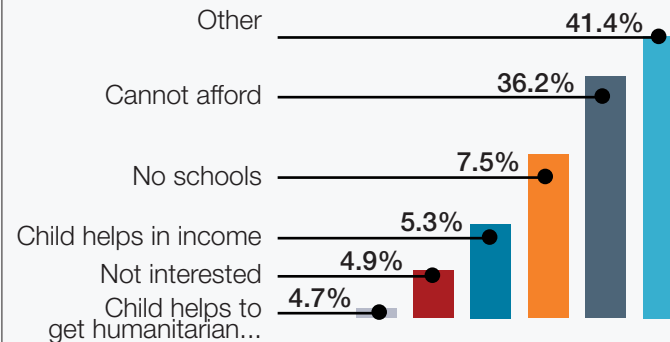
## REGION AND DISTRICT OF ORIGIN

## Reason for Lack of School Attendance



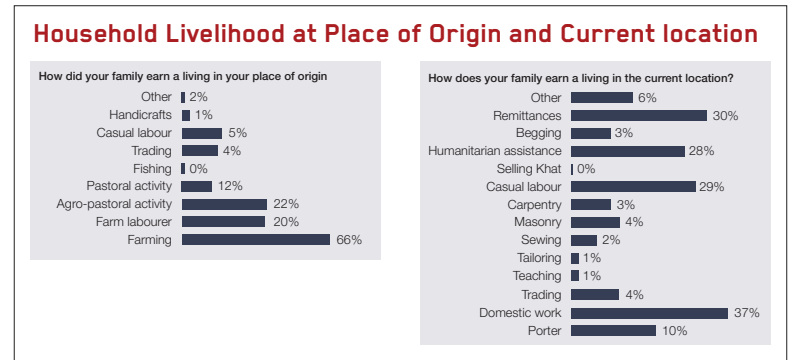
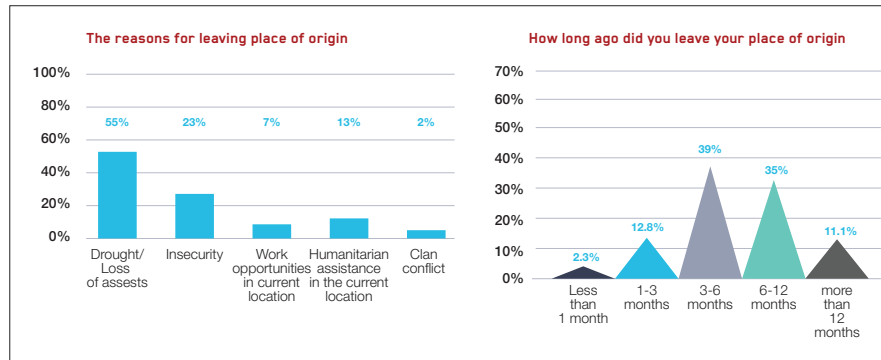

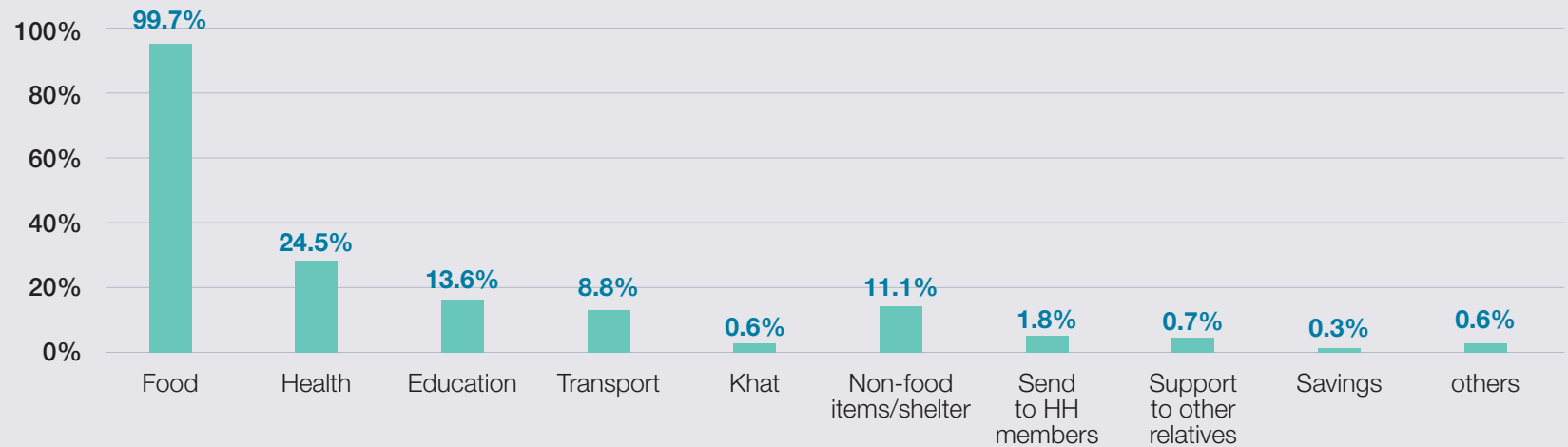

## REASONS FOR LEAVING PLACE OF ORIGIN

Majority (55%) of the households indicated drought and loss of assets as the reason for leaving their place of origin. Drought continues to drive displacement as people move from rural to urban areas in search of assistance. Others cited insecurity (23%), access to humanitarian assistance (13%), work opportunities (7%) in the current location and clan conflict (2%).

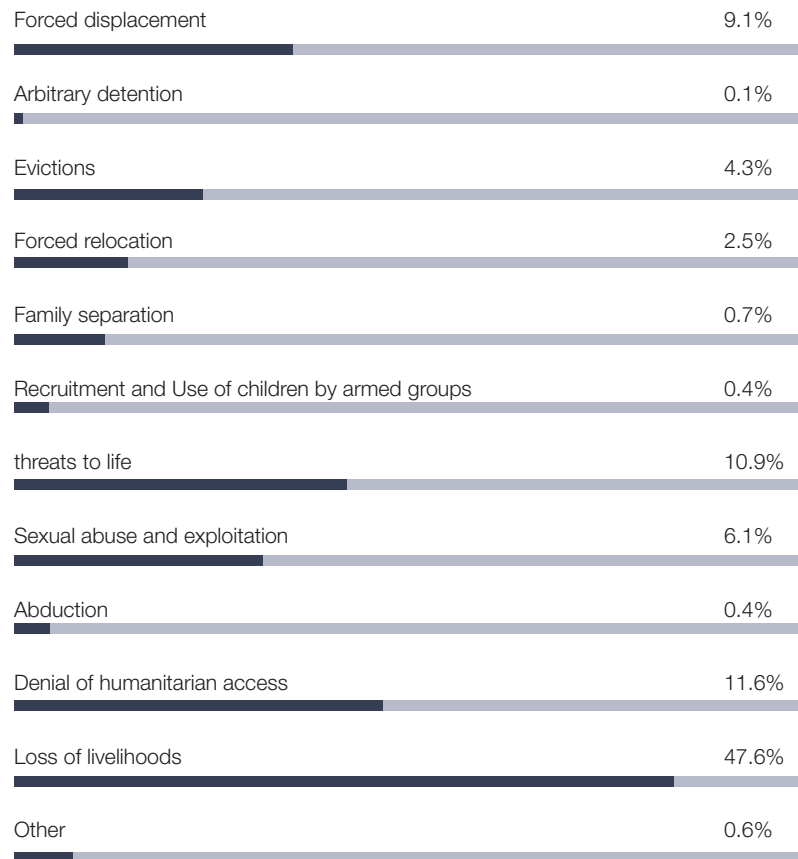

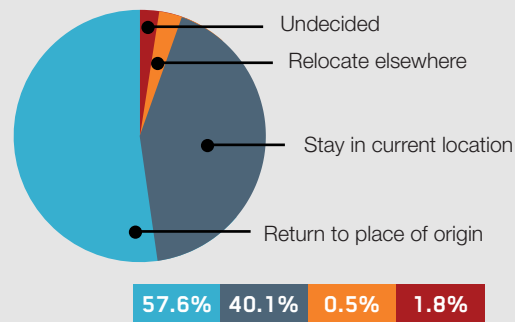

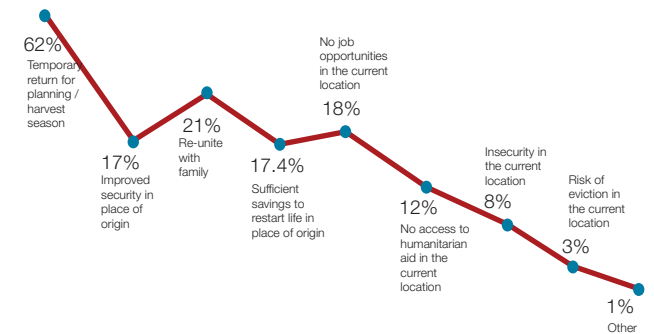
## HOUSEHOLD PROTECTION CONCERNS AT CURRENT LOCATION



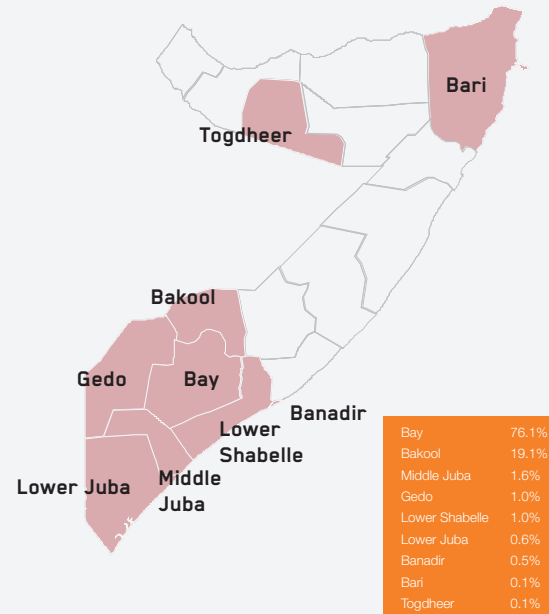

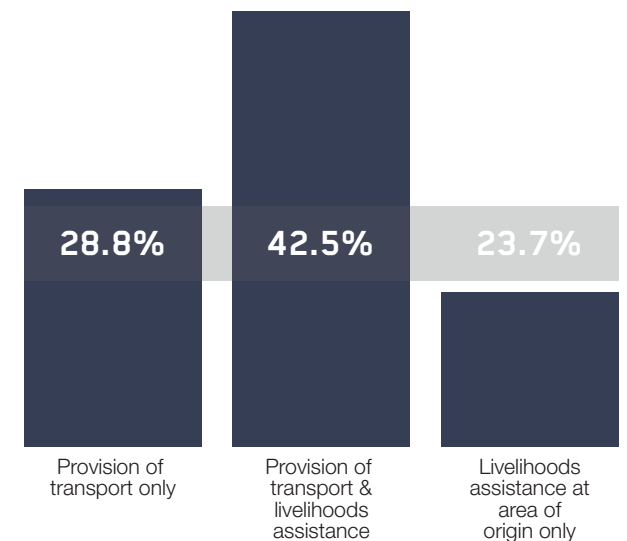

## TYPE OF SUPPORT REQUIRED BY RETURNEES AT PLACE OF ORIGIN

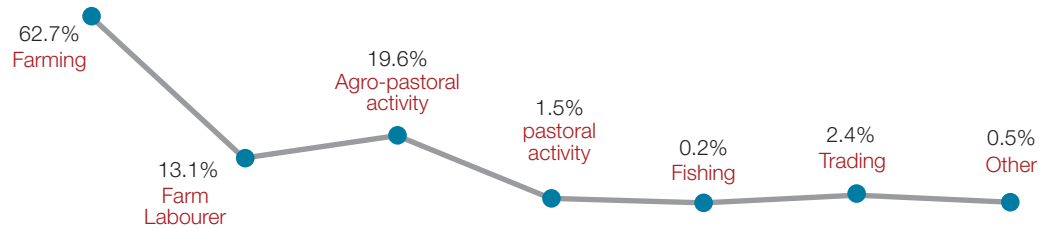

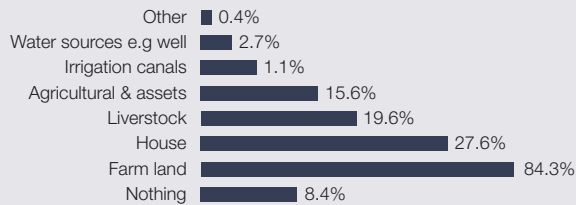

## SOURCE OF LIVELIHOODS AFTER RETURN



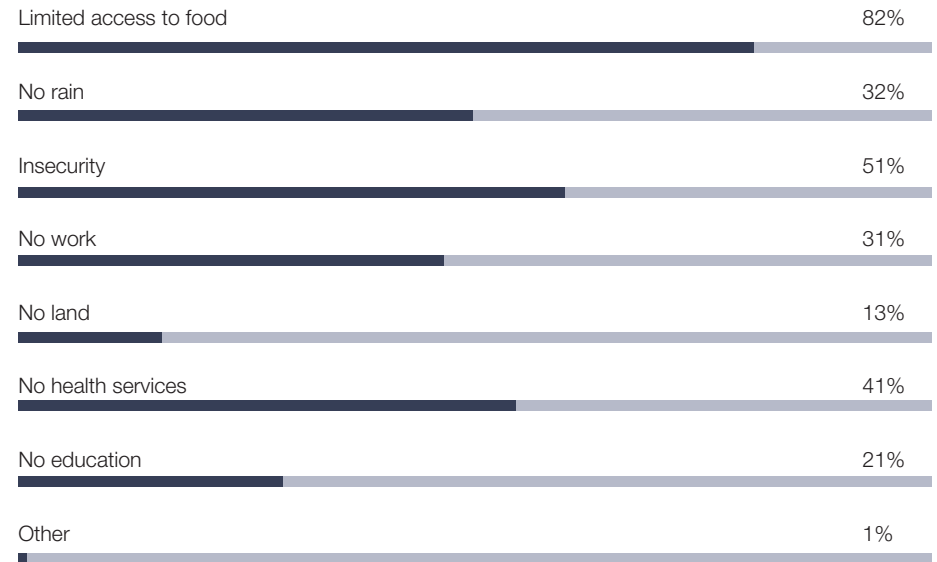
## Assets at place of origin that Households have access to when they get back



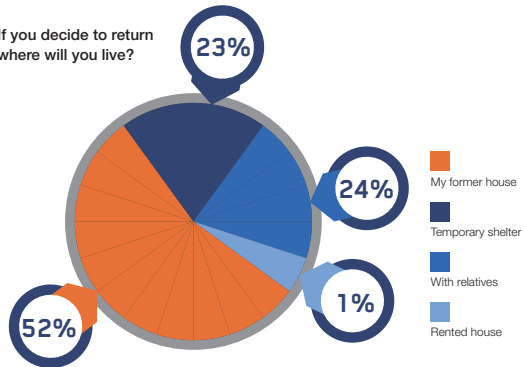
## Information on the conditions/status of households possessions and other assets in place of origin



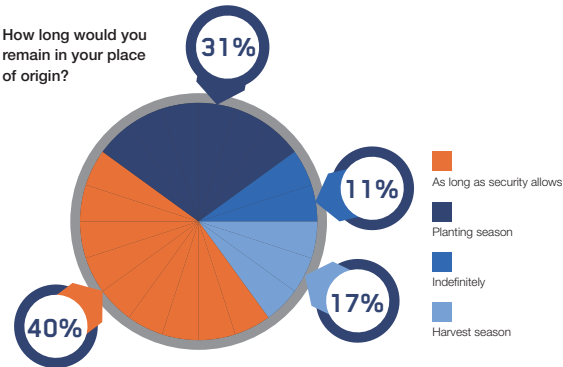
## MAIN CHALLENGES HOUSEHOLD WILL FACE IN PLACE OF ORIGIN AFTER RETURN



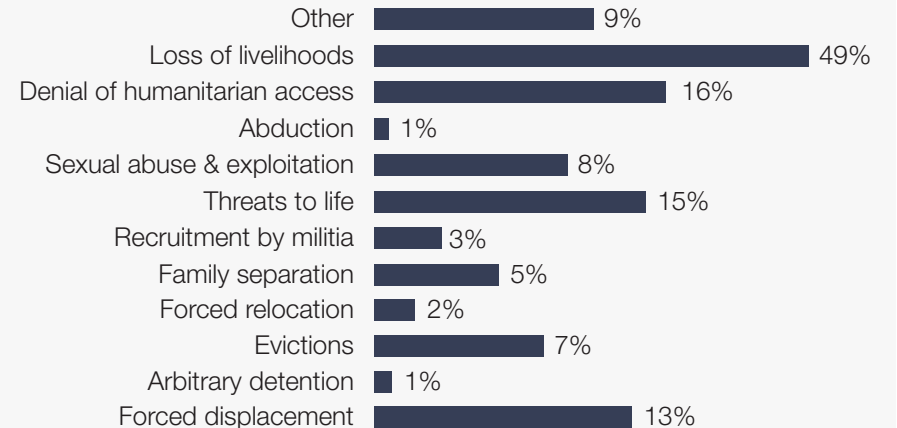
## If you decide to return where will you live?



## How long would you remain in your place of origin?

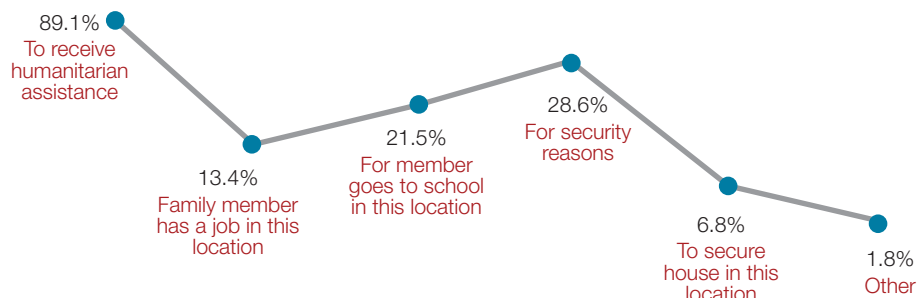

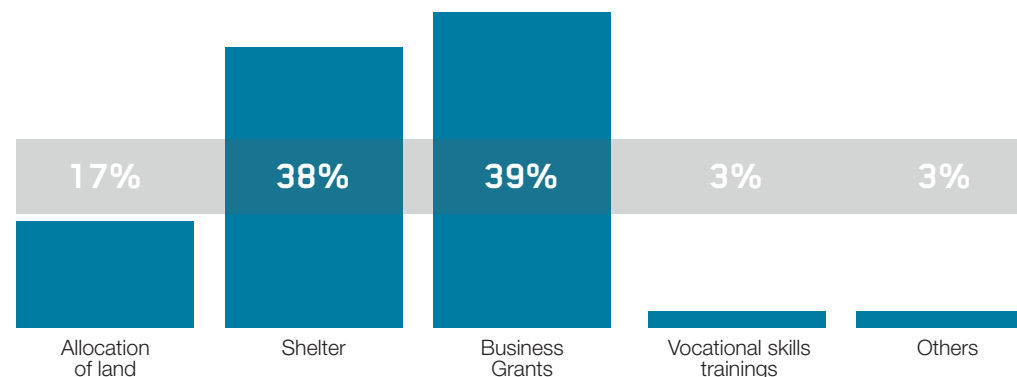

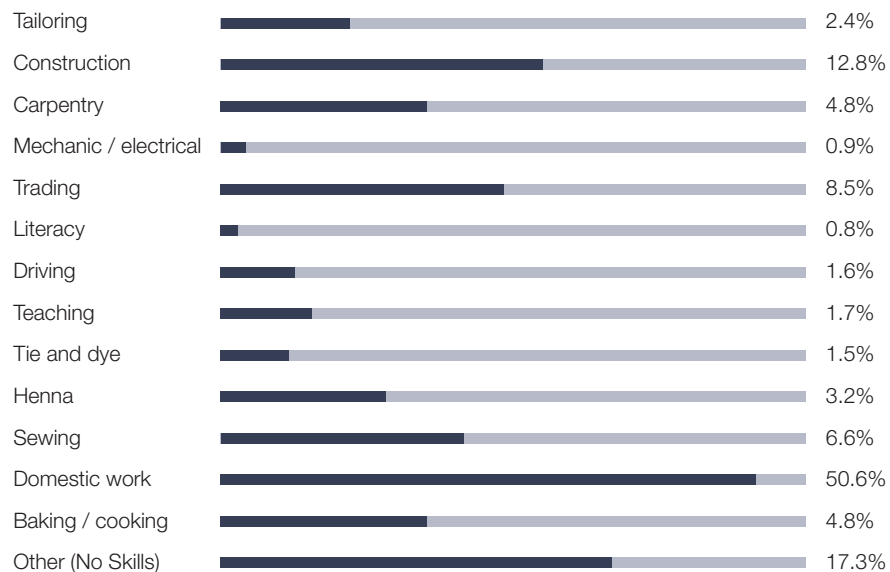

### RECOMMENDATIONS

#### Returning to original place

1. Provide transportation and livelihood support to the IDPs returning to their original place.
2. provide return packages that could sustain voluntary IDP returnees' household income until planting and harvesting of the farms happen at the place of origin,
3. Provide agricultural inputs to enhance sustainable and durable solutions for the returnees.
4. provide building materials for shelter to improve the households living condition and increase protection.

#### IDPs staying in the current location

5. Provide building materials for shelter to improve the households living condition and increase protection,
6. Invest in livelihood training skills especially for the youth and women who are staying in the current location
7. Provision of small grants especially for women to improve their livelihoods and,
8. Address the main protection concerns including; loss of livelihoods, denial of humanitarian access and other vices in partnership with the respective administration and putting checks and balances.
